### ONE

"For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Chirst. For in one Spirit we were all baptized into one body - Jews or Greeks, slaves or free – and we were all made to drink of one Spirit." 1 Corinthians 12:12-13

There is an oft-circulated cartoon of an elephant with this pleading, perplexed and frightened look on its face. It's precariously balanced right on the very edge of a cliff, just ready to fall. The only thing keeping it from plummeting over the edge is the fact that it has its tail wrapped around the stem of a daisy. The caption, reads: "Sometimes you just gotta hold on!"

There's a lot of truth in that. Life is hard, and if anyone tries to tell you differently, they're probably trying to sell something. At times it's all we can do just to hold on. Life can deal out some pretty nasty blows and when it does, it really gets hard to hold on. We grasp at almost anything. We feel like the elephant: frightened and perplexed.

When life grabs us and gives us a good shake, when we find ourselves hanging on like that elephant, what do we do? Where do we turn?

As followers of Jesus, we turn to Him, and then we turn to each other, the body of Christ. That's why this passage from 1 Corinthians is so important. It speaks of the unity of God's people, of real teamwork, of living in an extraordinary way. This passage gives us some unusual marching orders that look downright silly and old school in our culture. Unity in a dog-eat-dog world? Teamwork in a time when most people think the phrase "Look out for #1" is really in the bible? That's right! Whether we recognize it or not, Christians around the world and around the block have ONE Spirit.

As the Body of Christ, we are all born of ONE Spirit. We've all received the same baptism from the same Lord and consequently we're all filled with the same spirit, God's Holy Spirit. I cringe when people say "I was baptized Lutheran," because there is really no such thing as an exclusive "Lutheran Baptism," as if somehow we've got a corner on the market. I don't care if you've got a Catholic, Baptist, Methodist or Inter-Denominational background or if you were raised in the holy church of St. Sleep-in-on-Sundays – what matters is that followers of Jesus have ONE Spirit.

It's this ONE Spirit that holds us together in the hard times of struggle and the hard times of tragedy and trial. When there are people praying together in a hospital room, that's the Holy Spirit at work. When there are people making meals for families that are struggling with illness and death, that's the Holy Spirit at work.

When there are people who are willing to sit and hold someone whose heart is breaking, and cry with them, that's the Holy Spirit at work. We don't do these things because we're "nice" people, we do them because we're the body of Christ and we have ONE Spirit.

Think of it this way. When the Christian church is functioning at its best, we have many hearts, but ONE HEARTBEAT. Feel your heart for just a moment. Now imagine that everyone in our community is on the same beat. When we are at our best we are. ONE heartbeat for those in pain, ONE heartbeat for those who are celebrating, ONE heartbeat for those who our society has no use for, ONE heartbeat for those welcoming new babies, ONE heartbeat for those who those people who have no family, ONE heartbeat for those who are sick and dying, ONE heartbeat that's in tune with God's own heart.

I thank Jesus everyday that I am a part of His body in our little corner of the world. Sometimes life throws us curves. Sometimes we can't help but smile. Together we can help each other hold on and together we can make this world a different place. Why? Because in our best and worst moments, we still have ONE Spirit and ONE heartbeat.





## About MaaSAE Girls Lutheran Secondary School (MGLSS)

MGLSS is a first-of-its-kind residential secondary school for girls from the Maasai tribes of Tanzania. MGLSS was founded in 1995 and celebrated its first graduating class in 1999. Since that time, more than 800 students have graduated from the school.

MGLSS is unique in having created a 3-month "Preform" program that allows students entering their Form 1 year to better prepare for a secondary education. This is necessary as the quality of primary schools in Tanzania varies greatly. Girls education is also not strongly valued by the Maasai people, and so students may need additional support in their early years at the school to catch up to grade level, or may even repeat one year of school. MGLSS strives to create every opportunity for disadvantaged girls to succeed.

Each year Operation Bootstrap Africa and our sponsors provide scholarships for more than half of the students at MGLSS. A scholarship covers the cost of a secondary school education for a student who would otherwise be unable to afford it.

Students come to the school primarily from rural and often distant

villages, and return home during breaks two times each school year. OBA and MGLSS commit to providing a safe and healthy environment for students while they are away from their families.

#### **Education in Tanzania**

School is free and government-provided in Tanzania , but in a public school one teacher will have an average class size of 160 students.

Less than 30% of students achieve a secondary school education, and less than 3% attend university.

#### Academic Calendar

Forms 1-4 attend school January-October. This is the equivalent a junior high and early high school education. After Form 4, students take their national exams and are either placed in a technical school or continue on to Forms 5-6 of secondary school

Forms 5-6 attend school July-May. This is the equivalent of the first year of university. After graduation, Form 6 students take additional national exams. Those students who pass their exams

are able to continue their studies in university and are placed in a school by the Tanzanian government.

MGLSS is ranked in the top 7% of schools in Tanzania. Most students continue on to careers in education and healthcare.


