

# **Advent Confession and Forgiveness**

## Confession and Absolution (Advent 2021)

- L: In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.
- C: Amen.
- L: Lord of the universe, here in your house we seek your presence. We long for wisdom, inspiration and peace.
- C: Come, Holy Spirit, shine into our souls!
- L: Lord of all people, you call us your daughters and sons; you know us and love us. We long to know where you might lead us.
- C: Come, Holy Spirit, let your light shine on our way!
- L: Spirit of truth, pour your light into our souls and speak to us in this moment of silence.

#### Sacred Silence

- L: Lord, after all, we are still captive to sin and cannot free ourselves. Together we confess:
- C: We acknowledge that we have rebelled against you in many ways, by what we have done and by what we have left undone. Help us embrace and extend your love through thoughts, words, and deeds. You make everything new, including us.




