

Gospel: Mark 11:1-11, 14:3-9

¹When they were approaching Jerusalem, at Bethphage and Bethany, near the Mount of Olives, he sent two of his disciples ² and said to them, "Go into the village ahead of you, and immediately as you enter it, you will find tied there a colt that has never been ridden; untie it and bring it. 3If anyone says to you, 'Why are you doing this?' just say this, 'The Lord needs it and will send it back here immediately.'" They went away and found a colt tied near a door, outside in the street. As they were untying it, 5some of the bystanders said to them, "What are you doing, untying the colt?" ⁶They told them what Jesus had said; and they allowed them to take it. ⁷Then they brought the colt to Jesus and threw their cloaks on it; and he sat on it. 8Many people spread their cloaks on the road, and others spread leafy branches that they had cut in the fields. ⁹Then those who went ahead and those who followed were shouting, "Hosanna! Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord! ¹⁰Blessed is the coming kingdom of our ancestor David! Hosanna in the highest heaven!"11Then he entered Jerusalem and went into the temple; and when he had looked around at everything, as it was already late, he went out to Bethany with the twelve. ³While he was at Bethany in the house of Simon the leper, as he sat at the table, a woman came with an alabaster jar of very costly ointment of nard, and she broke open the jar and poured the ointment on his head. 4But some were there who said to one another in anger, "Why was the ointment wasted in this way? ⁵For this ointment could have been sold for more than three hundred denarii, and the money given to the poor." And they scolded her. ⁶But Jesus said, "Let her alone; why do you trouble her? She has performed a good service for me. ⁷For you always have the poor with you, and you can show kindness to them whenever you wish; but you will not always have me. 8She has done what she could; she has anointed my body beforehand for its burial. ⁹Truly I tell you, wherever the good news is proclaimed in the whole world, what she has done will be told in remembrance of her."

- P: Look to us, Lord. Look beyond the palms, beyond the image we project and into our souls.
- C: We are hungry.
- P: We realize the brokenness of our economy and value the opportunity to work more now than ever.
- C: We hunger for work and purpose.
- P: We live in a broken world in which the few have too much and the many have too little.
- C: We hunger for justice.
- P: Our communities are broken; far too often we do not know the person down the street or down the pew.
- C: We hunger for connection.
- P: We see broken governments that rise against one another, killing soldiers and those caught in the middle.
- C: We hunger for peace.
- P: We have broken homes whose peace is shattered by domestic violence but no one hears the sound.
- C: We hunger for freedom.
- P: We live in the shadow of death. Disease and disaster remind us of life's frailty.
- C: We hunger for resurrection.
- P: We experience a broken world and sometimes wonder where you are, Lord. So we hold our palms, shout out 'Hosanna' and 'Messiah' to the last, great hope for the world, knowing that somehow in this holy mystery, only a broken God can offer hope and transformation to a broken world.
- C: God's love never quits. Even now.



Sunday School is accepting candy donations for the Easter Egg hunt on Sunday March 31st! Please drop donations off in narthex or office by March 25th.


