BLAZING HOT SUMMER (IN MORE WAYS THAN ONE)

Summer is almost here!While the rest of the country celebrates the first day of summer on June 20, we know that summer arrives in Arizona on or around May 15. While the temperatures have been somewhat mild to this point, we all know what is coming. We are very nearly in blazing hot territory, where we learn once again that seat belts make very good branding irons.

However, temperatures are not the only things with the potential to soar after May 15. I invite you to turn up the heat on your spiritual lives this summer, wherever you are and whatever you are doing. What follows is a list of "grace-filled" activities for you to consider this summer that will both honor God and deepen your faith as you focus on the reality that God doesn't take the summer off. What's more, of the items on this list are designed to bring you joy.

- 1. On the Road with Prince of Peace Before you escape for the entire summer or for your next vacation, pick up a laminated Prince of Peace placard (available in the racks in the church lobby). Then make a conscious effort to take a photo of you/your family holding the placard in whatever amazing setting you find yourself (be creative!) After you have taken the photo, spend a few minutes in prayer, thanking God for his many blessings and lifting up the ministry of Prince of Peace. Then send the photo to us to be included on our display boar at POP. Wherever you are in the world, you can remain connected to God and your community of faith through the gift of prayer.
- 2. Worship God Wherever You Are Include a visit to a local church in your travel itineraries. Be flexible and creative. Choose a different brand of Christianity and worship with them. Or choose a church with a visually stunning sanctuary and worship with them. Think of it as an opportunity to increase your exposure to the many different shades of Christianity in our world. Then bring back a worship program (AKA bulletin) from your adventure in ecumenism.

- 3. Encourage People Select some folks that could use some encouragement. It could be the flight attendants on your next plane ride, nurses/doctors/office workers at your next medical appointment or even leaders at random churches/homeless shelters/social service agencies wherever you find yourself. Then deliver a small gift to the person leading that ministry. It could be anything (but you can't go wrong with a Starbucks gift card!) The most important thing is that you thank the person for the work they are doing and let them know you will pray for them (and then do so). Imagine the look on the person's face when you make this small gesture of encouragement. Even better, select a few small gifts before you travel and challenge yourself to give them all away before you return. Together we can bless people wherever we find ourselves and have fun doing it.
- 4. Develop Your Own Ritual Prayer Moments Challenge yourself to pray at certain times or when certain things are happening. For instance, pray on arrival in airports, towns, hotels, etc. Or pray at departure. Or pray at sunrise or sunset. Or pray when you are stopped at red lights. Develop an easy to remember prayer ritual and stick to it. No grand prayers are needed. Simply thank God for his presence and you will discover you can feel his presence more deeply. If you have a family, include them in the challenge (little kids are great at reminding us to do things!)

As always, if you are in town, I'd love to see you at Prince of Peace, either on Sunday mornings or for an iced coffee on a random weekday (just call ahead). Together we can heat up our spiritual lives with intention and joy. Have a "grace-filled" summer.





Partners in Ministry: Pastor Kristin



Meeting the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Zambia

Since arriving in Zambia a little over a year ago, I have focused on meeting the people of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Zambia (ELCZa), understanding the ministry of the church, and learning about and living into the diversity of cultures in Zambia. (There are 73 languages spoken here!) One of my

favorite parts of being a missionary is listening and learning how culture and faith are put together and lived out in different ways in different places.

My work in Zambia has three foci: supporting the administrative leadership, connecting ELCZa students studying on scholarships from the ELCA or Lutheran World Federation with the needs of the church, and partnering with ELCZa pastors to increase ministry capacity in congregations. In 2023, I will also begin working with Youth League leaders to develop their leadership capacity and long-term planning.

In this work, I often need to remind myself that progress is made up of many small steps. Please join me in celebrating both the small and big steps made in ELCZa this past year: the Church Council met for the first time since COVID began, we created the first ELCZa lectionary calendar, construction of the new
