Both rebuilding and restoring imply putting something back together just as it was, an impossible task after the seismic shifts we have experienced. Locking our focus on the past as a road map to the future is both unproductive and just plain boring. Each of us is a different person now, for better or worse. enticing prospect of many fresh starts. I love how this is described in 2 Corinthians: "The old life is gone; a new life burgeons! Look at it!" That is step one — recognizing the opportunities before us. Step two is trusting that the future God has prepared for us, our new life, burgeons. What a perfect word for this moment! Like a new plant peeking its first green shoot out of the ground, God promises that we will grow rapidly with positive perspectives, peaceful hearts, inquisitive minds and boundless energy as we lean into the new lives God has given each of us. While shaking off the pain of the past, we can embark on new adventures with a definitive hope that we will flourish. That is simply the wav God works.

For Prince of Peace, here are the first lines I would write in our new chapter together. I encourage you to come up with your own list or find your place to jump in and contribute.

1. Welcome/Worship. These two actions are tightly linked. God invites us to receive divine encouragement on a weekly basis and inspires us to widen the circle by welcoming everyone. We need everyone to work to make this happen on Sunday mornings, from greeters at the front door to a team to run the video system to a team dedicated to discovering new ways to sing, pray and preach. 2. **Community Building**. Simply put, we need each other. This hunger for togetherness that each of us feels is more acute than it has ever been before. By creating pathways for people to share life together once again, by truly welcoming those who are now looking to find deep connections and by creating pathways to serve other people together, we will find strength.

3. Strengthen Our Partnerships. No person is an island and no church is either. Partnering with other energized people and organizations is one of the strongest moves we can make to make Jesus visible in our world. Potential Actions: Launch youth theater program in August, launch crossover ministry plan with Shepherd of the Hills UCC in September, launch preschool partnership with Hospice of the Valley in October

While this is an ambitious list, it is achievable when we are focused on God's promise to deliver burgeoning new life. I look forward to taking the first steps in Prince of Peace's next chapter together. Here we are, God! Send us!

 the calmness run through my veins.
 I felt like God was there with me. He
 was with me in the place of calm. It
 felt amazing. I remember this moment
 because it felt like he was there with
 me through the experience.
- ◆ Austin Pierce. As a Lutheran I believe that God is a big part of acceptance as God accepts everybody. My faith and acceptance moment was when I first came to Prince of Peace. I felt this because it was a very fun day and I actually enjoyed church and also

My Vaccine Journey

We've all been navigating our way through this Covid-19 pandemic for over a year now. For many it has meant job changes, isolation from loved ones, learning how to do personal interaction virtually, and ... lots of television time! For some, it meant contracting the virus with various degrees of suffering. Late last August, I received a letter in the mail asking if I would like to participate in a Covid-19 vaccine clinical study. At the time, the Pfizer and Moderna vaccines were just starting to make the front page news. Not sure why I got the mailing, but I logged onto my laptop and selected an interview time for the following week. My history of shots, and medical care in general, is minimal. I had all the required infant vaccines and a couple of tetanus shots in my life. Never a flu shot. But I decided, if selected, I could be part of a cure.

The initial Zoom interview was scheduled for 5:10 a.m. on a Monday in early September. An LPN explained that Johnson & Johnson was developing their own vaccine. She asked basic health questions and described the goals of the study in more detail. After the call I was green-lighted for an in-person exam in October at the medical lab that would be doing the testing. I was asked to read and consent to a 38-page document that explained everything about the study — number of visits, procedures to be used, who the participants were (60,000 of us worldwide!), and the risks. My actual injection appointment was then scheduled for late November.

I only told a few people what I was doing, eliciting both support and questioning comments. I really hadn't thought that much about the risks until my scheduled "vaccine day" was approaching. In that two-month period, the other vaccines were approved for use and the number of COVID cases and deaths continued to climb. I decided praying about it would give me answers, help and protection. Hey it's Johnson & Johnson ... they make baby products, what could go wrong, and it's only one shot! I was nervous driving there that day and decided that I would opt out. This just wasn't going to fit into my schedule, I was scared about the

risks, couldn't get sick, and the list went on. As part of the study, I was required to monitor my oxygen level, body temperature and injection details and load the data into a study app. Well, on that particular day, the app was unable to load onto my I-Phone and I thought — God gave me my answer! I was asked to return a week later. Good, I'll have time to rethink this whole thing. That next week I asked God to give me a sign. My Bible studies and daily devotional readings have said to listen what God is telling you, feel the nudges. But before I knew it, I was raising my sleeve for the injection. The app was now on my phone. Everything went smoothly. However, it is a double blind study did I get the placebo or vaccine?

For fourteen days I reported my symptoms or, in my case, non-symptoms. I felt great! I continued to social distance, wash my hands and mask up. My January and February visits consisted of more nasal swabs and blood draws. The visits were to become less frequent, but I had committed to a 24-month study. On March 16 I got a phone call telling me the pharmaceutical company had decided to "unblind" the study. Since the other two vaccines were now being administered to so many people, I'm sure they felt they had an obligation to let participants know their status. On Friday, March 19, I sat in a sterile medical room waiting for the answer. After more nasal swabs and blood draws, ten minutes waiting for the doctor seemed like an eternity. Please God, let it be the vaccine, I repeated many times. But I had felt so good, no symptoms, it's probably the placebo.

On December 7, 2020, I DID receive the actual Johnson & Johnson COVID vaccine. And I have the card to prove it! What a relief, although we all still must maintain the protocols for now. I decided to sign another consent to continue with the study for five years. This will enable further research into the effectiveness of the vaccine and help prepare the world for (gasp!) future pandemics. I realize that getting the vaccine is a personal choice, but I believe it is my faith that guided me through this journey.
