## From Wimps to Warriors

Some people talk about change as if it is something to be avoided or delayed. Others can't wait for changes to occur, especially those going through difficult times. If you're like me, you bounce between those two extremes, depending on the day and the issue at hand. Any time we are confronted with change in our lives or in our church, the most important question to ask is, "Who is initiating this change?"

Two thousand years ago, on a day called Pentecost, an explosive event occurred that changed the course of human history. Pentecost means literally "50." It was an annual Jewish festival that took place fifty days after another Jewish festival called Passover. At the Passover festival Jesus had been killed. Three days later he walked out of his tomb.

Jews living within 20 miles of Jerusalem were required by law to attend the Pentecost festival. Thousands of other Jews from neighboring countries flocked to Jerusalem for the celebration. All told, the city was packed for this Pentecost festival described in the second chapter of Acts.

On the day of Pentecost about 120 followers of Jesus gathered in an up-

per room in Jerusalem. They were excited because they had seen the risen Christ. At the same time, they feared that they would suffer the same fate he had suffered if they identified themselves as "Christ-followers." They were also confused about what shape their lives would take (sound familiar?).

Then came Pentecost! It was an electrifying day, one that they would talk about for the rest of their lives. At Pentecost a rag-tag band of misfits was transformed into a highly potent group of world-changers. The disciples were so excited and bold that at least one festival-goer in Jerusalem thought they were drunk. Dr. Bill Bouknight writes, "The wimps became warriors!"

Who initiated this astounding change in their identities? God did. More specifically, "All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit." Most Lutheran Christians have a hard time describing how the Holy Spirit works in our lives. As a rule we tend to be skeptical of anything labeled "Pentecostal." There are many ways we could describe the Holy Spirit: He is

our comforter, our energizer and our guide. Perhaps the most important is this: The Holy Spirit initiates desperately-needed changes in our lives. Think of it this way: The Holy Spirit shakes us up when we need to be shaken up.

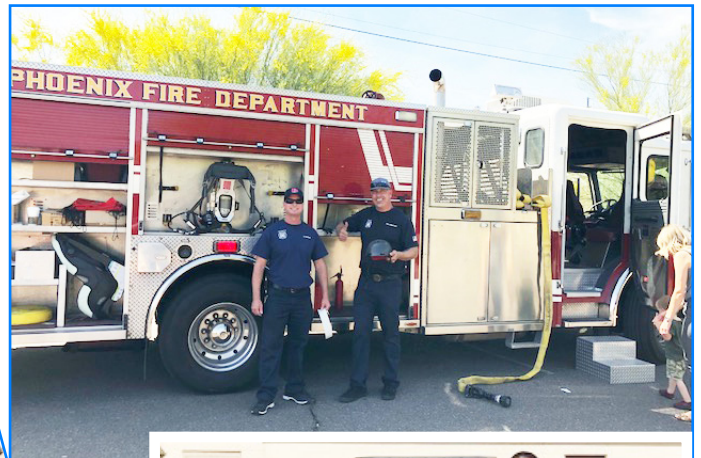

# It's Allergy Season!!

Seasonal allergies announce their presence every spring as temperatures warm and again in the fall as temperatures cool, with sneezing, coughing, watery and itching eyes and a running nose. Allergies develop when the body's immune system becomes sensitized and overreacts to something in the environment such as pollen, mold or pet dander that typically cause no problem for most people. Symptoms may be mild to severe. Early symptoms may be confused with those of a cold until they are still present weeks, not days later. However, symptoms that include aches and pains and a fever are indications of a cold, not allergies.

It is difficult to prevent all exposure to the agents that cause allergies but steps can be taken to reduce contact. Pollen counts are especially high on warm, windy days so when those weather conditions are present stay inside as much as possible. Avoid outdoor activity in the early morning when pollen counts are high. Delegate lawn mowing, weed pulling and other gardening chores to someone who doesn't suffer from allergies. Close doors and windows at night and during the day if pollen counts are high. Use the air conditioner in the house and car.

Clean floors with a vacuum cleaner that has a HEPA filter. Local news stations often include the pollen count as part of the weather forecast to help allergy sufferers plan daily



activities. It might be helpful to consult an allergist to determine specific triggers so that efforts can be made to avoid them.

Allergies are frequently treated with antihistamines, decongestants in capsule or spray form, or nasal steroids. There is no shortage of over-the-counter products available and most, if not all, are actively advertised. Antihistamines help reduce watery itchy eyes and sneezing. Early antihistamines caused drowsiness which prevented their use during the day. The newest generation of antihistamines has eliminated drowsiness as a side effect. Packaging now frequently states that the product is non-drowsy. Decongestants are often used in combination with antihistamines to thin nasal secretions and reduce sinus discomfort by reducing swelling. Nasal steroids are taken to help decrease inflammation, swelling and mucus

production. Some recommend that when pollen levels are forecast to be high, begin taking medication before symptoms appear.

Those who suffer from extreme allergies, not helped by allergy medications or if allergy medications interact with other medications, may want to consider allergy shots, also known as desensitization and immunotherapy. The desensitization process works by injecting small amounts of a specific substance or substances that cause the patient allergies. The injection contains enough allergens to stimulate the immune system but not enough to cause an allergic reaction. Over time the amount of the allergen is gradually increased. For the injections to be effective, it is necessary to know what the patient is allergic to. It often takes over three to five years for the shots to be totally effective.

The one positive thing about the heat of summer, as temperatures in the desert southwest climb, pollen production decreases and for most people, allergy symptoms decline.
