Let the Children Come

Jesus said, "Let the little children come to me, and do not stop them, for the kingdom of heaven belongs to such as these." Matthew 14:19)

ometimes God gives us a pathway forward that involves creating something new. On May 19, we celebrated the formal dedication of our new Infant and Toddler Care Center, affectionately nicknamed POPIT. On June 3, we will open the doors for the first time and begin a new chapter in our congregation as we partner with families to provide excellent care for their little ones. On August 6, by God's grace, we will begin operating POPIT at full capacity (36 children). Almost every spot is filled and some age groups have long waiting lists. I am amazed that we are here. There are so many people to thank. Some worked in a specific stage of the project and some for the entire time.

This journey began with a simple question over beer and sandwiches at OHSO. One day in the spring of 2014, I had the pleasure of spending time with Bishop Steve Talmage and members of the Church Council to discuss future ministry. The bishop encouraged us to ask our community what it needs most. So, we did. After hundreds of conversations, a clear need emerged: infant and toddler care for working parents. It just so happens that this community need lined up closely with our gifts and experience as a congregation. A dream was born.

When Nicole Hilden was hired as preschool director in December 2015, her job description included "explore the feasibility of infant and toddler

care." So, she did. I want to thank Nicole, Courteney Greenwell (Assistant Preschool Director), Val Kainass (Preschool Advisory Board Chair) and the entire Preschool Advisory Board. Together they asked the question, "Is this possible?" They visited preschools that featured infant and toddler care, talked to state regulators, and put together a preliminary business model. Also, special thanks to Jim Schmidlin who did the first "proof of concept" work on remodeling two of our buildings. They moved the dream forward.

Under the leadership first of Gail Andrews and then Gwen Jacobs, the Church Council began to seriously consider the dream by asking the question, "What would it take to do this?" I am extremely grateful that Gail, Gwen and the entire Church Council invested so much energy in forming the dream into a workable plan. Also, a special thank you to Jack Ranby who encouraged us to explore the concept from many different angles and compiled an extensive document outlining questions and answers.

At this point three things happened that changed the question to "Why wouldn't we do this?" First, Drew Goodman stepped forward and volunteered his professional expertise in project management. Drew put together preliminary architectural drawings and helped us compile a detailed and realistic budget. Drew then walked with us through every major step moving forward and gave so much of himself to the project. Without his

efforts we simply wouldn't be here. Thank you, Drew.

The only remaining question was how to pay for the project. Almost immediately, Jeff and Sharon Stevens stepped in with a gift of \$700,000. This gift was given to honor their parents, Gene and Jan Stevens, and their love of God and Prince of Peace. Thank you, Jeff and Sharon. In addition, the POP Foundation heard about the project and believed in it so much they contributed \$100,000 that they had set aside for another purpose. Thank you, POP Foundation.

With huge pieces in place, the Church Council voted to move forward and the congregation overwhelmingly approved the project in May 2018 (almost exactly one year ago). The Preschool Expansion Team was formed to manage the project and are still working to bring all the last-minute details to completion. What an incredible bunch of "doers." Special thanks to Steve Edgar, Janet DeJonge, Scott and Nancy Stevens for joining me in a solid year of work, including one if not two meetings nearly every week.

Also, special thanks to our staff who went above and beyond their job descriptions to make major contributions. Maria Renovato and Keri Herding invested countless hours in thousands of crazy details and interior design. Audrey Cox and Paul Nelson filled in to help me with my existing

workload so I could invest time in the project. On the preschool side, Nicole and Courteney tapped Angela Sherrill, Yvonne Scaramella and Tracy Snyder to help create the program — including registering new families, hiring teachers, setting classroom standards, creating a volunteer program and so much more. Thank you all.

A special thank you to the countless groups who lived through the disruption of the construction phase over the past eight months (forced flexibility) — including Sew & Tie, Quilters, POP Youth, Nursery, AA, Tai Chi, Boy Scouts, Arcadia Music Academy, and all of you who navigated dumpsters in the parking lot. And another special thank you to the "Spring Cleaning" group that met every Thursday for five months to clean out, organize and reorganize numerous rooms on campus and, in some cases, preserve 60-years' worth of the history of Prince of Peace.

This project has been an incredible example of a congregation coming together. So many of you have contributed your labor, your encouragement and your prayers. Thank you. Finally, we thank God for walking with us from beginning to end. There have been so many moments when divine inspiration was the only thing that kept the train rolling forward.

Now we begin a new chapter in the life of Prince of Peace. Now we welcome children and their families in a new and exciting way. Now we give thanks that God's dreams may be difficult but are always good. Our work has only just begun!

Let me share with you some of the upcoming opportunities to extend support to other ministries:

▼ June — Alleluia Lutheran Church's Diaper Ministry

This important ministry supports low-income working women with a portion of their monthly need of disposable diapers. Children must have disposable diapers in order to be placed in daycare. Alleluia researched this need and secured solid direction from a variety of agencies in order to best serve the working poor. Our ingathering, in support of them, will include: disposable diapers (all sizes), wipes and gift cards to Walmart. Gift cards will be used by the program coordinators to purchase diapers. ▼ July — Personal Care Items for Homeless and Transitioning Veterans

Items must be FULL SIZED. We will pack items into gallon-size ziplock bags. We will have the bags and the list of items to place in them available in the narthex beginning June 30. This is a wonderful way to thank those who help us keep the liberty celebrated on July 4th.

▼ August — Lunches For Learning

A ministry of education for the poorest children of Honduras. Details to come shortly. As well, back-to- school always brings the need for school supplies. When shopping for your own children, please consider adding additional items for other children. We will share our collection with the children of Vista del Camino.

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Drug Disclaimers

Have you ever read or heard an advertisement that included the following language: "These statements have not been evaluated by the Food and Drug Administration. These products are not intended to diagnose, treat, cure or prevent any disease?" Lately, there seem to be more and more products containing the disclaimer. Although it is sometimes obvious from the claims made, have you ever wondered why such a disclaimer is necessary?

One of the Food and Drug Administration's (FDA) primary responsibilities is protecting the public health by ensuring the safety, efficacy, and security of human and veterinary drugs, biological products and medical devices. Because of this duty, only drugs can claim to diagnose, treat, cure or prevent disease. Advertisements for FDA-approved drugs contain health claims which specifically refer to how an ingredient(s) impacts a disease or health condition. There are two types of health claims. Authorized health claims are based on a consensus in publically-available scientific information on the matter. The FDA publishes a list of authorized health claims.

Qualified health claims are validated by a significant amount of scientific evidence. To prevent consumers from being misled, the amount of scientific evidence must be made clear in labeling and advertising.

However, claims made by products containing the disclaimer are known as structure and function claims, which are not reviewed by the FDA. Structure/function claims refer to how ingredients impact the structure or function of the body. These claims are very different from health claims made by prescription or overthe-counter drugs. The structure/ functions claims are not necessarily false, but remember the old adage that if something sounds too good to be true, it likely is. Before purchasing any product (even one with a money-back guarantee) that includes the disclaimer "these statements have not been evaluated by the Food and Drug Administration, do some research and check with your healthcare provider to verify that scientific evidence supports the claims made. These products may not harm you but they may not help.
