n June 16, 1976, an estimated 20,000 South African students in the black township of Soweto poured into the streets to protest the oppression of the Apartheid government, specifically the introduction of Afrikaans as the medium of instruction in local schools. What was designed to be a peaceful protest soon turned into a riot as police began shooting at the young protesters in an attempt to disperse the crowd. At the end of the day, roughly 176 people were killed. Images of "June 16" quickly circled the world, shocking millions and bringing down international condemnation on the Apartheid government. The 16th of June is now a public holiday, Youth Day, in South Africa, in remembrance of the events in 1976.

One of the lesser-known stories of that horrific day occurred at Regina Mundi church, Soweto's largest Catholic Church. As the riots began and chaos took hold, students fled for sanctuary to Regina Mundi. With buckets of water at the ready, they managed to douse the tear-gas canisters thrown into the church by police. Soon after, police stormed the church, firing live ammunition. Although no one was killed, many were injured and several of the church's sacred symbols were damaged, including a large statue of Jesus. In their rush to escape, a wave of children toppled the statue to the ground, shattering its hands.

In the aftermath of June 16, the missing hands were not repaired. Instead, a placard was added to the statue that reads, "Christ has no hands but ours." This powerful image

is in reference to a prayer by Saint Teresa of Avila (1515-1582):

"Lord Christ, you have no body on earth but ours, no hands but ours, no feet but ours. Ours are the eyes through which your compassion must look out on the world. Ours are the feet by which you may still go about doing good. Ours are the hands with which you bless people now. Bless our minds and bodies, that we may be a blessing to others. Amen." The statue still stands, without hands.

It is our time to be Jesus' hands, feet, voice and heart, both across the street and around the world. It is our time to build Prince of Peace into a community that stands as a beacon of hope amidst the confusion all around us. It is our time to invest our lives in something more than the accumulation of wealth and the pursuit of comfort. It is our time to do great and mighty things for God.

Ten years ago, you called me as your

pastor, not to do ministry for you but to inspire and equip you to do it yourselves. For a decade I have invited you to step forth with great energy and courage, to build a powerful and prevailing church. We have accomplished some great things together. I remain fully energized and excited to dream big about what we can do next. I need you. But more importantly, your Savior needs you. Together we can...

- Continue to build worship services that are as warm as they are celebratory, where every person is greeted and known.
- Continue to build a family ministry where every child is gleefully engaged and every parent is encouraged.
- Continue to build an adult community where people share life's challenges and joys in groups both large and small.
- Continue to show radical love to those who live on the margins of society.
- Continue to answer the question, "What can we do to make our community glad that we exist?"

As long as there is darkness in our world, we will continue to bring light. As long as there is injustice in our world, we will continue to bring hope through meaningful action. As long as there is division in our world, we will continue to bring healing. Prince of Peace needs your best ideas, your courage and your energy. It has never stopped being the time to roll up our sleeves and get to work. All of us. Christ has no hands but ours.


POP Preschool Staff Commissioning



A 60-Day Journey Toward Justice in a Culture of Gun Violence (ELCA)

The Evangelical Lutheran Church in America is saddened by the all-too-frequent occurrences of gun violence in the U.S. We mourn the loss of life. We grieve for the victims and their families who often feel silenced. And we lament for those who have done violence to others and often feel removed from a community of faith.

We invite you on a journey of prayer, scripture, stories and church teachings with this resource, "A 60-Day Journey Toward Justice in a Culture of Gun Violence." Together through daily observances, it calls us to work toward the prevention of gun violence as people of God who strive for justice and peace in all the world. It may be used for individual

reflection, group Bible study, adult education sessions, and congregational daily devotions.

In 1994, the ELCA adopted the social message Community Violence, calling for advocacy to end the cycle of violence in the U.S. Twenty-five years later, this message is still relevant and should be considered another resource on your journey. Also available to download are an easy-to-use guide and appendix noting key documents and actions, and a gun violence litany.
