## Freedom, Truth and Disneyland

have always been fascinated by Disneyland, also known as "The Happiest Place on Earth." And while I have jokingly tweaked that mantra to, "The Most Exhausting Place on Earth," Disneyland never ceases to capture my imagination. When someone walks through the turnstiles of the park, there is a commotion as children run around with undeniable excitement. There really is nothing better than experiencing a child shaking with joyful anticipation. Walking through the park is like stepping into an alternative reality. Disneyland expends a great deal of energy and dollars to maintain an image of perfection. The decorations are pristine, the crowd management is precise (with helpful Disney "cast" members available to show you exactly where to walk) and the landscaping is breathtaking (not a leaf out of place).

Cleanliness and order abound! If a child spills popcorn on the streets, inevitably someone swoops in to sweep it up. The bathrooms never have a scrap of paper on the floors. The store shelves are always stocked, the eateries never run out of soft drinks and the street-side vendors always have plenty of churros. The amazing thing is that the public almost never sees how this is accomplished — it just "magically" happens. I remain astounded at the level of organization required to pull this off 365 days a year. I would say that Disneyland runs with "military precision" but perhaps the term should be "Disneyland precision." Maintaining the image of perfection is what Disneyland

is all about. It's great to escape to that world once in a while.

However, our reality is quite different. We face serious challenges in our lives. We have shortages of time and money (and energy). Our houses get dirty (those floors don't clean themselves). Our lives get complicated (and rarely is there someone readily available to point the way forward). We need something substantially more than a temporary escape. We need the truth.

Jesus said, "If you continue in my word, you are truly my disciples; and you will know the truth, and the truth will make you free." John 8:32

The truth is that life is difficult. The truth is that we are not perfect and our world isn't either. The truth is that we are in bondage to sin and cannot free ourselves.

But there is more. The truth is that we have a God who loves us so completely that he has done everything to reach us. The truth is that the cross of Jesus Christ bridges the gap between our failures and God's greatness. The truth is that we are not abandoned and certainly not alone. The truth is that God can overcome any challenge.

Walking out of Disneyland is a forced transition from one world to another. For me, it always feels like freedom. The little moments when God breaks through into the murkiness of our world are much more exciting than Disney's manufactured perfection.

We have the opportunity to experience numerous little moments of God this month. In the coming days we will celebrate the return of Allen Quie from his summer sabbatical, the rite of Confirmation, Preschool Trunk or Treat, and so many more that we cannot anticipate. The truth is that life is so much better when we stop trying to escape the challenges before us. God does his best work in the muck. Let freedom ring!

uniforms for those children. It is a joint effort of the school parents and the food provided by donations to Lunches for Learning. The story of the beginning of this ministry is awe-inspiring and we will continue to share it in future newsletters. For the month of October we are asking that you consider helping a child stay in school at the cost of \$150 per year or \$15 per month.

It is officially fall and it feels a bit like the summer heat has left us alone. I think I just heard all of you breathe a sigh of relief. I want to provide a few highlights from our September Council meeting.

The 2019/20 Campus Maintenance Project (Post-POPIT) was unanimously approved by Council. This project will be funded from a surplus remaining in the Preschool Expansion Account. The following projects will be completed: replace the roof on the administration building, replace/repair the roof on Gangsei Hall, paint the administration building, replace the Preschool north playground, plus funds will be contributed to a Preschool Scholarship Fund. Thank you to the Preschool Expansion Committee (Janet DeJonge, Steve Edgar and Scott and Nancy Stevens) for their service on this team.

Council also approved sending Angela to a continuing education conference, the AYME Conference in Minneapolis, in October. The focus is on faith formation and educational leadership in ministry. This should prove to be an invaluable educational experience for Angela. She will return with a wealth of knowledge that she will share with the preschool staff.

A few weeks ago, the church staff, Nicole, Jayce and I attended a workshop led by Linda Staats. The intent for the workshop was to strengthen relationships and foundations as POP staff and key leaders; assess the gifts and passions of the staff and leaders to conduct an inventory of our ministries. Linda provided us with much insight, ideas and suggestions. It was time well spent!

We will kick off our stewardship campaign in October. I encourage you to consider, prayerfully and mindfully, your stewardship of the blessings you have received. Throughout the year, the stewardship ministry at POP will be about growing as disciples of Jesus, strengthening our faith practices and together encouraging generosity in the faithful stewardship of God's abundant blessings.

The two graduated from MaaSae Girls Lutheran Secondary School and are continuing their post-secondary schooling. Jackline is studying Pharmacology at Kampal University and Namayani is going for a three-year nursing degree at Arusha Lutheran Medical Centre. Our scholarship support is \$2,200 each.



## Update from ELCA Missionary Kristin Engstrom in Senegal



Prince of Peace continues to be blessed with our partnership with ELCA Missionary Rev. Kristin Engstrom who serves as the Young Adult in Global Mission (YAGM) coordinator in Senegal. A new group of young adults arrived in Senegal in September to begin their one-year service and immersion experience. What follows is a blog post from Charlie as he describes a Senegalese welcome.

"Laughter is key here in Senegal. From what I am told, a good sense of humor is very important to our survival. Having a good attitude about learning to live in a new culture helps everyone adjust. But the Senegalese go beyond this sense of grace, it is ingrained into who they are. The people here love to joke! Most conversations I have experienced here start with a friendly banter, back and forth, quick and witty. For example, the YAGM group met one of the church youth, Albert, who loved to tease us about how we don't know the local language yet. Sounds silly, but he was more than happy to welcome us to his country and encouraged us to start practicing with him.

Using humor and sarcasm is part of who I am, so I appreciate this communication style. I just can't wait until my language skill gets better and I can respond! Teranga, teranga, teranga! This word, meaning hospitality in Wolof, is one of the most highly prized traditional values in Senegal. Considered a duty, people go out of their way to make you feel welcome. Ever since stepping off the plane, I have felt this sense of care surround me. I am a guest here right now, but I hope teranga is something I can carry with me back in the states and practice while I am in Senegal.

As a final thought, I encourage you to ponder how you welcome the stranger into your community, as I have been welcomed here so far. Do you make the effort to greet the passerby? Does humor act as a sense of inclusion or as an act of harm? How do you practice hospitality with visitors in your home and community?"
