# "What Now?" Discovering Your Christmas Mission

"Do not be afraid; for see — I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is the Messiah, the Lord." Luke 2:10-11

dvent is here! It's time to prepare Lour hearts, minds and homes for Christmas. This will be my 11th Christmas in Arizona and over that time I have transformed from a Christmas cynic to a full-fledged enthusiast. I love focusing on Jesus and retelling the story of how He entered the world to become one of us. I love the way families come together to cherish old memories while creating new ones. I love Christmas lights and nativity scenes and Christmas carols sung with emotion and gusto. I love watching my daughters rip open presents with an energy level that is just one step down from what occurs in a nuclear reactor. I also love when Starbucks rolls out another season of eggnog lattes. Most of all, I love lighting candles on Christmas Eve as a protest against the darkness in our world.

However, there is one moment on Christmas morning that I have always dreaded. After the last present has been opened and the last "thank you" expressed, my family sits and stares at two piles. The first is a pile of newly unwrapped gifts and the other a pile of discarded wrapping paper destined for a landfill. Traditionally there is a time of silence while everyone moves from the rush of anticipation to the inevitable question, "Now what?"

Over the years I have developed

a plan to survive this moment and extend the celebration far beyond December 25th. When my family comes to our "now what?" moment, I go to the discarded pile of wrapping paper to locate a piece that I can cut into a semi-regular  $8^{1/2}$  x 11-inch sheet. Then I find a quiet spot in our house. On that sheet of wrapping paper I write the twelve months of the following year. January. February. And so on. Next to each month, I write the name of one of my family members or close friends. Then I brainstorm ways to make a bold investment in that person's life during that month. This way I can look forward to greeting each month of the new year with a new task at hand.

It's a simple investment strategy that I hope will show those closest to me that the real meaning of Christmas cannot be contained in one twenty-four hour period. After the pile of wrapping paper (minus one piece) is cleaned up and the colorful lights come down and Starbucks returns to its traditional menu, Jesus will still stand with us. Thankfully Jesus has always refused to be packed away with the Christmas decorations.

I pray that you will enjoy an adventurous Advent and a beautiful Christmas! I look forward to seeing you at Prince of Peace.




## Share a Poinsettia



## 6th Annual Arcadia Cares Food for Kidz Packathon

Saturday, March 21

With the stressful and busy holiday season already upon us, it's easy to lose sight of those less fortunate, including the hungry children right here in our neighborhood. When the festivities and excitement of the holidays are over, the empty tummies and sadness of these children and their families remain.

Prince of Peace will embrace and tackle

these issues by hosting the Sixth Annual Arcadia Cares: Food for Kidz packathon on Saturday, March 21, 2020, in Gangsei Hall. The entire Arcadia community is again being invited to join members of our church in assembly line packing of meals for hungry children and their families locally and internationally.

The Food for Kidz model provides individually packed, highly nutri-

tious and filling meals packed with rice, beans, vitamins and dehydrated vegetables. Each meal provides a day's worth of vitamins and nutrients to enable children to grow up strong and fight off diseases and sickness.

More than 122,000 meals were packed at the 2019 event. The goal for 2020 is 115,000 meals. As was the case with the 2019 packathon, the majority of the meals packed will help feed the hungry in the Phoenix metro area.

#### Volunteers Needed

Several hundred volunteers are needed to have a successful event. All ages from three on up are welcome to participate. Sign-ups will begin on January 26.




